1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The Greater Nanticoke Area School District will continue to follow all PA DOH, PDE and CDC guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Depending upon the public health conditions in our region and the Commonwealth, there could be additional actions, orders, or guidance provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) and/or the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH). The District will practice and support mitigation efforts in response to changing conditions. The District is prepared to practice prevention and mitigation strategies along a continuum of most to least restrictive in response to the changing conditions of the Pandemic.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The Greater Nanticoke Area School District will offer full in-person instruction to all students during the 2021-2022 school year. If the school needs to move to the virtual mode of instruction due to a COVID-19 outbreak based on an unknown variant that is not covered by current available vaccines, students will work from home utilizing their assigned Google Chromebook. Google Chromebooks will be issued the first week of school. Students may also choose the Greater Nanticoke Area Cyber Academy if parents do not feel like sending their children back to school due to COVID-19 concerns.

Attendance will be taken in school for all face-to-face learning days. In the case of remote learning days, verification and completion of assignments will be counted as attendance and to track instructional hours. Students will be expected to complete all materials posted on Google Classroom in the event remote instruction needs to be employed.

The Greater Nanticoke Area School District will continue to employ a mental health worker during the school year to assist students with mental health needs. The worker is employed through a PCCD Grant.

Students and teachers in Grades K-12 in all district buildings will be required to wear face masks until enough students are vaccinated and teachers receive booster shots per CDC guidelines. Students will be instructed on proper mask wearing strategies the first day of school.</p> <p>2. The district will adhere to any guidelines regarding wearing of masks per the PA DOH, CDC, and PDE.</p>
<p>b. Modifying facilities to allow for <u>physical distancing</u> (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);</p>	<p>1. All students will be socially distanced a minimum of three feet or more in classrooms and cafeterias per CDC guidelines.</p> <p>2. Students in Kennedy Early Childhood Center will continue to eat breakfast and lunch in their classrooms.</p> <p>3. Students in the Elementary Center will eat lunch both in their classrooms and in the gymnasium to keep them distant on a rotating basis.</p> <p>4. High School and Educational Center students will eat in the cafeteria keeping a minimum of three feet social distanced at cafeteria tables.</p>

	5. The district will adhere to the current CDC, PA DOH, and PDE guidelines established.
c. <u>Handwashing and respiratory etiquette</u> ;	All students will be constantly reviewing handwashing and respiratory etiquette during the school year in grades K-12 per CDC, PA DOH and PDE guidelines.
d. <u>Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation</u> ;	Follow current CDC, PA DOH, and PDE guidelines for cleaning and ventilation. Continue SOP cleaning protocols.
e. <u>Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments</u> ;	<p>All positive cases in school will be reported to the Department of Health. Contact tracing and isolation of non-vaccinated students will occur in cases whereby students are designated as a close contact. The district will monitor closely cases of quarantined students as well as those positive cases.</p> <p>Follow current CDC, PA DOH, and PDE guidelines for contact tracing, isolation, and quarantine guidance.</p>
f. <u>Diagnostic and screening testing</u> ;	Diagnostic and screening testing will be done at the discretion of parents at their choosing. Temperature checks will be reinstated if conditions warrant. Follow any current diagnostic testing and screening procedures required by the PA DOC and PDE.
g. <u>Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities</u> ;	Efforts to vaccinate students during the school day will continue throughout the school year. Two vaccination sessions were scheduled last year and another session is being arranged for students ages 12 and up in September upon return to school.

For example, students unable to wear masks due to health concerns or students that are intellectually challenged</p>

Coordination with state and local health officials.</p>	<p>All cases will be reported to the State Department of Health for contact tracing purposes.</p> <p>Maintain existing partnerships with local and state PA DOH and PDE and emergency management as needed. Refer to PA DOH as needed for guidance on responding to evolving COVID situations.</p>


