What Title I Means

How does Palm Springs Community Middle School Qualify for Title I Support?

- The District sets Free and Reduced Priced Lunch (FRPL) percent threshold
- 70% elementary/middle schools and combined schools
- 67% for high schools
- Title I supplies additional funds to support students, staff, teachers, and families
- These funds are above what the District provide in terms of funding
- Title I funds concentrate on professional development for staff, and activities to strengthen our partnership with families

School staff will:

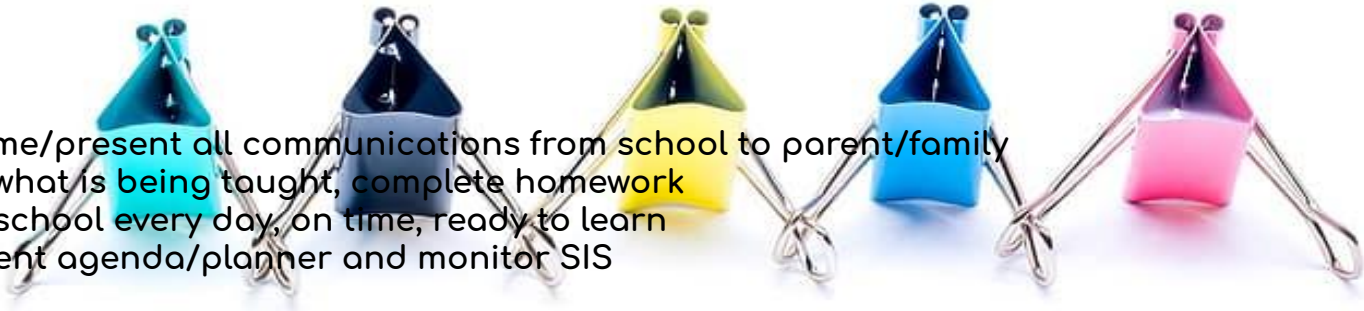
- Provide safe supportive effective learning environment
